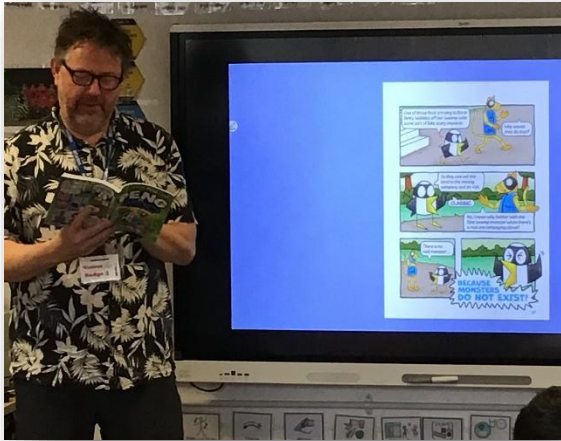
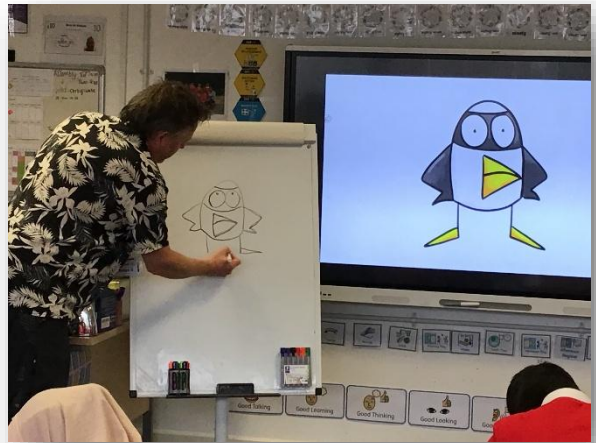


50'S LIBRARY VISIT

This week, class 50 visited Handsworth Library...



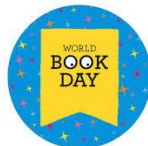
AUTHOR VISIT

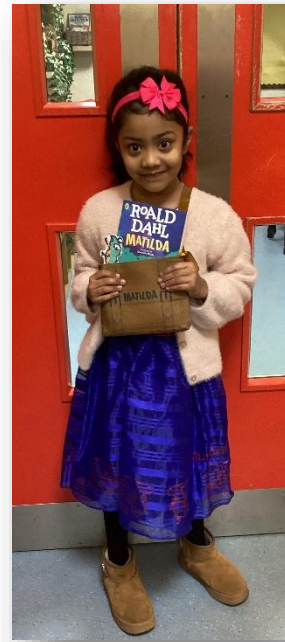

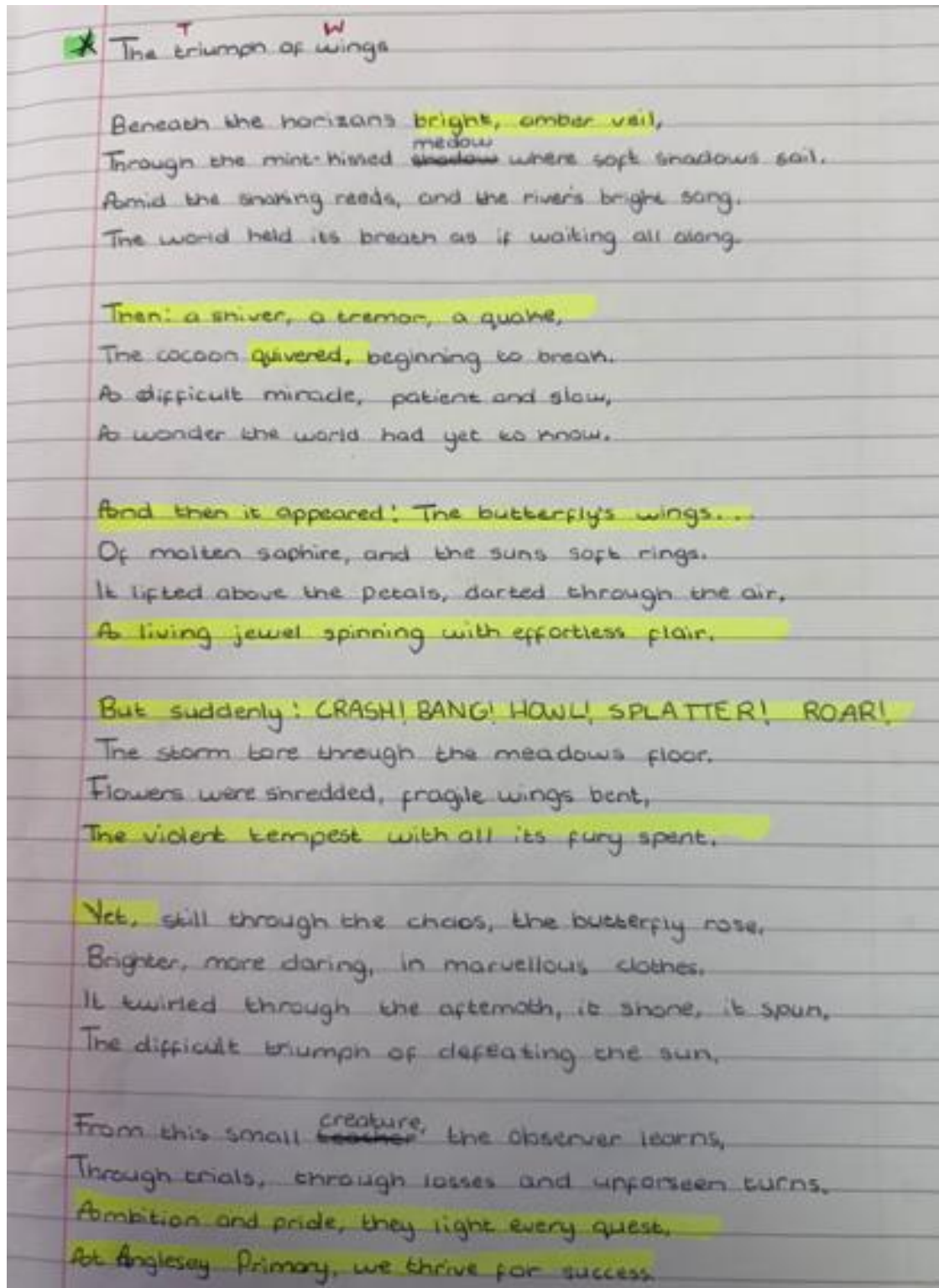

Ambition, pride, success, our wings in flight.

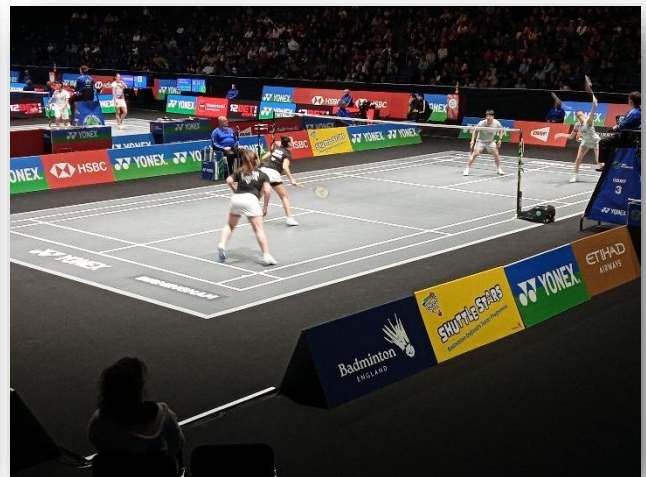
BADMINTON

The children thoroughly enjoyed the day and they would have slept well that night!

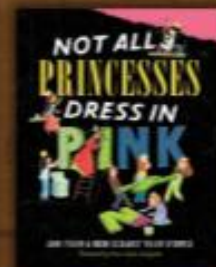
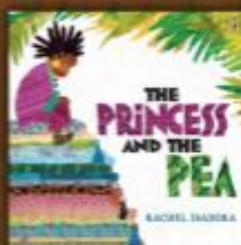
